

Civil Division

For the next 21 days, from March 16 to April 6, 2020, all civil matters in the Court, with the exception of emergency matters, will be continued for 21 days from the scheduled return date. Trials scheduled in that same time frame will also be continued. New trial dates may be scheduled by counsel through the Clerk's Office. "Emergency matters" include, but are not limited to, unlawful exclusions, civil commitment hearings, and any other matters the court deems "an emergency matter." Please contact the Clerk's Office if you need assistance in the determination of an emergency matter and to reschedule cases that were scheduled for trial during this period.

Criminal and Traffic Divisions

All cases involving **bailed (non-incarcerated) defendants** on the Court's criminal docket scheduled at 9:00 a.m., Monday through Friday, and the Court's traffic docket scheduled at 11:30 a.m., Monday through Friday, March 16 through April 10, 2020, are hereby CONTINUED on the Court's docket for 28 days from the currently scheduled court date; provided, however, that any trial or hearing involving an **incarcerated defendant** will proceed on the currently scheduled court date, subject to the disposition of any written motion for continuance filed hereafter.

From March 16 through April 10, 2020, the Court will continue to conduct hearings on bond motions, applications for protective order and any emergency motions filed in any case.

All parking, toll authority, bus video camera and Virginia Employment Commission cases are continued for 8 weeks, or 56 days, from the currently scheduled date.
