PUBLIC NOTICE

Effective March 16, 2020, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Virginia declared a Judicial Emergency for the Commonwealth of Virginia. Under the provisions of the Order Declaring a Judicial Emergency, Chesterfield Juvenile and Domestic Relations District Court is unable to provide non-essential, non-emergency services for a period of twenty-one (21 days); therefore, all civil, traffic, and criminal matters, are generally continued. In order to provide as much public information and guidance as possible, the Clerk's Office has developed the following guidelines for the types of cases we process and the impact the Judicial Emergency has on our service delivery.

- All inquiries should be directed to the Clerk of Court, Laura G. Griffin at lgriffin@vacourts.gov. You may also call the Court at 804-748-1379, but please expect longer than usual wait times. We encourage all to use email, where possible.
- The Court will continue to accept non-essential, non-emergent filings, where noted below, by U.S. Mail or email, but they will not be processed until April 6, 2020 (or later if the Order Declaring a Judicial Emergency is continued another twenty-one (21) days by the Chief Justice.)
 - Non-essential and non-emergent filings are governed by the Service Delivery Table, below.
- Emergency filings must be filed in accordance with the Service Delivery Table, below. They may be emailed to the Clerk in order to facilitate timely processing.

New petitions for non-emergent child custody and visitation will neither be processed nor accepted during this time. If you have an emergency child custody/visitation situation that requires immediate attention (i.e. cannot wait 21 days), you may file a new petition in Intake (or through your attorney), accompanied by an Emergency Hearing Request. Intake may be reached by calling 804-748-1372. Note, a \$25 filing fee applies for non-indigent petitioners. Form: Request for Emergency Hearing	NOTE: Non- emergent new petitions will not be accepted by Intake until after April 6, 2020, due to DJJ policies; therefore, the Court will not accept any attorney-filed non- emergent civil custody/visitation petitions until after April 6, 2020.
